## **Afghanistan National Army Program**

---

The Afghanistan District, US Army Corps of Engineers, primary mission is to support the US Army Combined Force Command-Afghanistan's mission to defeat the war on terror in Central Asia. The Corps has deployed several engineers, quality assurance representatives and technical experts across the country to support the overall program, including a primary mission, the Afghanistan National Army Program. With contract support from Western and Afghani agencies, the Corps is managing design and construction of troop barracks, dining facilities, motor pools, firing ranges, classrooms, sanitation facilities, and other utilities for the Afghanistan National Army's Brigades and Battalions.

The main project areas under the combined \$536 million ANA programs are the Pol-e-Charkhi Afghan National Army (ANA) installation, the Kabul Military Training Center, the Darualamn ANA installation, in Kabul, and installations in Mazar-eSharif, Herat, Kandahar and Gardez. The following projects encompass a combined total of more than 1300 acres and will support more than 56,000 active duty ANA troops.

- Pol-e-charki- The \$127 million project is currently in construction to build 124 structures including barracks, training, administration and support facilities for 24,000 ANA soldiers.
- Darualman- The \$52 million project is currently in construction to build 83 major structures including barracks, training and administrative and support buildings for more than 14,000 troops.
- Mazar-eSharif- The \$69 million project will build 71 major structures as well as a waste water treatment plant and power plant to provide life support for 3,000 troops.



- **Kabul Military Training Center/Military Entrance Processing Station-**  
The combined projects total \$190 million, with KMTC in construction and MEPS pending contract award. A total of 53 major structures will be built including barracks, training and processing support facilities for more than 6000 active troops.
- **Herat-** The \$52 million project is in construction to build 14 structures including barracks, administration and support facilities for 3,000 troops.
- **Kandahar-** The \$65 million project is currently in construction to build 14 structures including barracks, administration and support facilities for 3,000 troops.
- **Gardez-** The \$66 million project is currently in construction to build 14 structures including barracks, administration and support facilities for 3,000 troops.
