



**Calvin T. Williams**

Command Sergeant Major Calvin T. Williams, a native of Parkerburg, WV, has served in both the U.S. Army Reserves and the U.S. Air Force for a total of 33 years. He entered the U.S. Air Force in August 1973. He completed station unit training at Lackland AFB in San Antonio, TX, as a security specialist. CSM Williams reported for duty at Minot AFB, ND, as a military policeman. After completing that assignment, he was assigned to RAF Chicksands, England, then to Langley AFB, VA, also as a military policeman. After seven years of service, CSM Williams received an honorable discharge from the Air Force.

CSM Williams enlisted in the U.S. Army Reserves in April 1983, and was assigned to D Co., 463<sup>rd</sup> Engineer Battalion, Combat Heavy in Marietta, OH, as a carpentry/masonry specialist. He served with the 463<sup>rd</sup> for 12 years, where he subsequently served as construction squad leader and construction supervisor. He was then transferred to the 1/80 Engineer Battalion in Kingswood, WV, where he served as a training instructor and staff sergeant major. He served with the 577<sup>th</sup> Engineer Battalion, based at Fort Leonard Wood, MO, during Operation Enduring Freedom from Feb. 2003 to Feb. 2004. In July 2004, CSM Williams assumed responsibilities as the CSM of the Afghanistan Engineer District in Kabul, Afghanistan, until Dec. 2004. In May 2005, he was assigned to the 80<sup>th</sup> Division as the sergeant major of two Iraqi Training Battalions at Krikush Military Training Base in Iraq during Operation Iraqi Freedom. Following this assignment, CSM Williams assumed responsibilities as the command sergeant major of the 463<sup>rd</sup> Engineer Battalion in Sept. 2006. He was then assigned as the Command Sergeant Major of the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers Gulf Region Central District, based out of Camp Victory, Iraq, from Jan. 2008 to Jan. 2009. He assumed responsibilities as the Command Sergeant Major of the Afghanistan Engineer District – North on Dec. 10, 2009.

CSM Williams' military education includes Air Base Defense, Noncommissioned Orientation Course, Noncommissioned Officer Supervisors Course, Noncommissioned Officer Leadership Development Course, Carpentry/Masonry Course, Interior Electrician Course, Basic Noncommissioned Officer Course (Phase I & II), Battle Focus Instructor Training Course, Common Engineer Training Course, Combat Engineer Training Course, Small Group Instructor Course, Construction Quality Management for Contractors Course and Contracting Officer Representative Course. He is also a graduate of the non-resident Sergeant Major Academy.
