Lieutenant Colonel Stephen E. Lefebvre is a native of Rhode Island. He graduated, with a Bachelor's Degree in Civil Engineering from the University of Rhode Island. He received a Masters Degree in Environmental Science from the University of Oklahoma.

His military education includes the Engineer Officer Basic and Advanced Courses, Combined Arms and Services Staff College, and the U.S. Army Command and General Staff College.

Lieutenant Colonel Lefebvre began his military career in 1986 as a Platoon Leader, C Company, Executive Officer, HHC Company, and Battalion Construction Officer, in the 588th Engineer Battalion (Corps) (Combat) at Fort Polk, Louisiana; Adjutant (S-1) and A Company Commander in the 84th Engineer Combat Battalion (Heavy) at Schofield Barracks, Hawaii. In 1993, he became the Facilities Engineer for the U.S. Disciplinary Barracks, Fort Leavenworth, Kansas. From 1997 to 1999 he served as the Chief of Operations for the Directorate of Housing and Public Works and then Operations Officer (S-3) for the 1st of the 1st Infantry Battalion at the U.S. Military Academy at West Point, New York. Following that tour, Lieutenant Colonel Lefebvre served as the Engineer Chief for the 2nd Simulation Exercise Group in Bristol, Rhode Island. He then became an Instructor and Curriculum Development Officer for the Combined Arms Services Staff School at the U.S. Army Command and General Staff College. Lieutenant Colonel Lefebvre then deployed to Iraq for one year and served as the Gulf Region South District Commander's liaison to the Multinational Division Southeast. Lieutenant Colonel Lefebvre served as an Engineering Technical Lead on the Massachusetts Military Reservation Project, and most recently as the Deputy Commander for the New England District, U.S. Army Corps of Engineers.

Lieutenant Colonel Lefebvre's awards and decorations include the Bronze Star Medal, Meritorious Service Medal (5th OLC), Army Commendation Medal (1st OLC), Army Achievement Medal (2nd OLC), National Defense Service Medal (1 BSS), Global War on Terrorism Service Medal, Iraq Campaign Medal, Humanitarian Service Medal, Army Service Ribbon, Overseas Service Ribbon, Parachutist Badge, Ranger Tab, and the Army Superior Unit Award (1st OLC).
