Kristina Mullins is the Deputy District Engineer for Programs and Project Management and the highest ranking civilian in the district. She is responsible for making district commitments with sponsors and customers and ensuring those commitments are met through programs and project management business practices. She also directs formulation of the District's program and budget, and oversees and approves the operations budget.

Ms. Mullins has 13 years experience with the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers (USACE). She comes from the Little Rock District in Arkansas, where she served the last two years as the Chief of the Project Management Branch, and the Assistant Chief of Programs, successfully executing more than \$175 Million for the FY06 and FY07 Military, Civil and SFO Programs.

Prior to that, she was a Team Leader and Program Manager with the USACE Southwestern Division in Dallas for about two years, leading a team of professional engineers, scientists, planners, operations and real estate experts assigned to the Little Rock District Support Team. She served two years with the USACE Operations Division in Tampa as a Liaison Officer to U.S. Central Command, providing engineering and construction expertise and serving as the USACE single point of contact. She also served as a Program Manager for the USACE Southwestern Division Military Technical Directorate in Dallas for 16 months managing and coordinating the SWD's, DERP-IRP, BRAC-ER and Environmental Quality Programs. She also served five years with USACE Europe District in Wiesbaden, Germany as a Life Cycle Program Manager for the barracks restoration and construction program totaling \$900 Million, and as a Life Cycle Project Manager coordinating the efforts of U.S. and host nation architect and engineering design firms in the design, construction, maintenance and repair of U.S. military facilities throughout Europe.

Ms. Mullins earned a Bachelor of Science and Chemical Engineering degree from Oklahoma State University in 1993. She has been a member of the Society of American Military Engineers since 1996, and was Vice President for Programs in 1998. She has also been a member of the Project Management Institute since 2005.
