Corps of Engineers awards \$3.5 million contract for an Afghan National police headquarters

KABUL- The U.S. Army Corps of Engineers announced the contract award for the construction & design of an Afghanistan National Police uniform police headquarters located in the Sharana district of the Paktika Province, March 28.

Paktika Province is located in the southern portion of northern Afghanistan near the Pakistan border

The police headquarters will include an administration building, dining facility, open bay barracks, criminal investigation department, field replaceable unit, woman's barracks, guard towers and guard shacks.

The prime contractor for the \$3.5 million facility is Omran Holding Group Construction which is located in Kabul.

The headquarters is part of a larger effort by the U.S. and Afghan governments to build hundreds of Afghan police station, army base, roads, runways and other infrastructure projects to increase the country's security and stability.

The Afghanistan Engineer District-North oversees work in the northern and eastern portion of the country.
